

- UVM Campus AI Committee large, slow-moving, almost year old
 - Summer/Fall/Winter 2024 discussion focused on potential risks
 - Innovation and education Spring 2025 additions just starting
- Administrative and professional pressure to "do something" with Al and to innovate

Al Friday Concept Development

Pressure to "do something with Al" coupled with pressure to do nothing with Al.

Brainstormed ideas with Al Working Group and Research Data Services Group.

Needed a regularly scheduled, predictable event series

Speak to Al usefulness, hazards, and Al ethics in broad strokes, since UVM does not have policy in place yet. Guides, not authorities.

Develop cost-effective, lowbarrier event series that encourages exploration over expertise

Al Fridays: A New Event Series

Every other Friday morning, after Coffee & Code in atrium.

January 24 – May 2

Coffee at every event!

Big screen with laptop; large table, sometimes two

Easy setup and take down

No formal evaluation – keep it informal, simple, and non judgemental




Al Fridays: Guiding Principles

- Al agnostic
- Hands-on experience
- Demonstrate how a tool works
- Low-stakes, stress free environment
- Drop-in format: chose public space so participants can come and go as they please



Al Fridays: Guiding Principles

- Let conversation emerge organically
- Usually led to discussion on bias, environmental impact, ethical use of AI in higher ed, academic honesty, weaknesses in using AI, and strategies for using AI effectively



Al Fridays: Guiding Principles

Not pushing products

Not pushing Al on students, faculty, librarians, or staff

Logistics + Planning

RDS + AI Working Group open call for ideas

Sign-up spreadsheet in Teams w/ dates, topic, and equipment needs

All Al tools must be readily available!
